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Shinonuma is an island 90 minutes away from Nagoya by high-speed boat.



Tour activities in Shinonuma:

Drying wakame seaweed



Wakame is a type of seaweed which is eaten daily by most Japanese. It is nutritious and can be eaten raw. When dried, the nutritional value increases and can be preserved for a long time.

Wakame can lower cholesterol and blood pressure. It can also remove excess salt from the body which prevents arteriosclerosis. Bring home wakame seaweed as souvenir.

Oyster Farm Tour

Oyster farms are rare in Aichi so it is an exciting opportunity to learn more about how an oyster farm is managed.

Enjoy fresh shirasu (baby sardines) for lunch which is a specialty of Shinonuma.

Making local specialty

Experience making local dishes using local specialties of Shinonuma such as oysters and hijiki as well as nori. Hijiki is a type of seaweed that is rich in minerals, vitamins, and dietary fiber.

Get a chance to explore Shinonuma during the tour. Bicycle rental is also available.

Witness Atsumi Peninsula's road to sustainability through their nature and local industries.

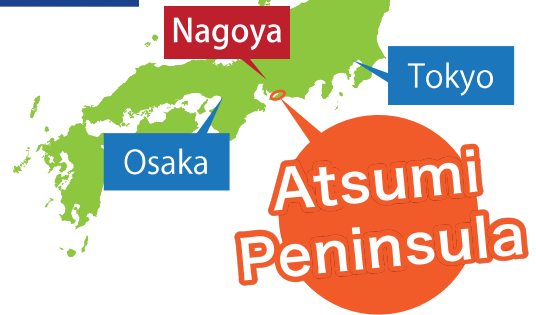


Michinoeki Tahara Mekkun House (Rest area)

Visit a fruit orchard where guests can enjoy a comfortable environment in which you can avoid shoes from getting muddy, and a vegetable farm where guests can enjoy organic vegetables.

Okazaki City, where Yamada Farm and Blueberry Farm Okazaki are located, is a 20-minute drive from Nagoya City.

Okazaki has many historical sites and is surrounded with nature.

It is the birthplace of Tokugawa Ieyasu who laid the foundation for the unification of Japan.

Okazaki Castle, known as the birthplace of Tokugawa Ieyasu, was built in 1455. The castle tower was rebuilt in 1959.

The castle tower was reconstructed in 1959 and is now open to the public as a historical museum.



Mifune Strawberry Park

Guests can pick melons and take them home. Enjoy a cozy café while eating melons and parfaits and taking pictures.

Okazaki City is a 60-minute drive from Nagoya City. It is full of nature and historical sites. Okazaki Castle was built in 1455 and it is where Tokugawa Ieyasu was born. He laid the foundation of the unification of Japan. The castle tower was restored in 1959 and is now open to the public as a historical museum.

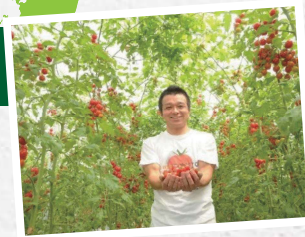

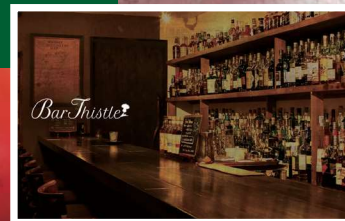

Nagoya Castle

Nagoya Castle was the seat of power for the Tokugawa family, who founded the Edo shogunate. The castle is located in a vast site of approximately 250,000 square meters, and in 1930, it became the first castle to be designated as National Treasure for its unique architectural design. The castle is well-known for having golden rooftop ornaments.



Osu Kannon and Osu Shopping Street

Osu is the sacred site of Kannon, one of the three great Kannon shrines in Japan. A statue of Hotei, one of the Seven Gods of Good Luck, is enshrined here. Enjoy a full day of shopping in a large shopping district near the shrine.



Arimatsu Shibori and the Arimatsu Townscape

Since its birth in the Edo period, Arimatsu Shibori has produced the majority of shibori products in Japan. On September 4, 1975, it was designated as Dentōkugei-hin (traditional Japanese craft). Experience Arimatsu shibori (traditional tie-dyeing). Enjoy the beautiful townscape Arimatsu.
